# JOHN 1:1-3

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made.

## THE WORD CREATED

Genesis 1:1 makes it clear that God created all things; however, the will of the Father to create was enacted through the Son, the Word.

# JOHN 1:1-3; GENESIS 1:1

...All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

## 1 CORINTHIANS 8:6

...there is one God, the Father. All things are from him, and we exist for him. And there is one Lord, Jesus Christ. All things are through him, and we exist through him.

## COLOSSIANS 1:16

For everything was created by him [Jesus], in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through him and for him.

# JOHN 17:24

"Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, so that they will see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the world's foundation."

## COLOSSIANS 1:17; HEBREWS 1:3

He is before all things, and by him all things hold together.
